# FLAGGER (ATSSA) CERTIFICATION AUGUST 24, 2017—RAYMOND

**Purpose:** Training flaggers to provide a safe passage of traffic through/around work zones and bringing standard flagging procedures to our nation’s roads

**WORKSHOP FEE:** The **Municipal Registration Fee** is \$100.00 and the **Private Registration Fee** is \$200.00. This price includes instruction, materials and catering. *These rates remain low due to generous grants from the FHWA and NHDOT.*

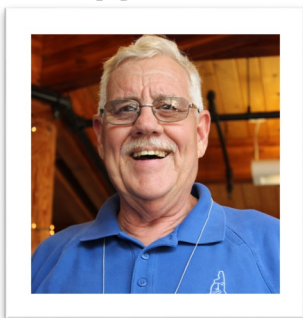
### What is this class about?

Flaggers are in a very dangerous and responsibility-ridden position, playing a crucial role in temporary traffic control. The safety of workers, motorists, and pedestrians is dependent upon the flagger’s performance. Since the flagger position involves safety, proper training is vital; flaggers are expected to pass a test to prove their proficiency and competence level. Students will receive their ATSSA Flagger Certification in the mail (upon successful completion of the exam). This certification will be valid for 4 years.
