**Recycling of all paper, cardboard, glass, #1 and #2 plastic containers, aluminum cans, steel (tin) cans, electronic components and scrap metal is mandatory.**

**RECYCLABLES**

**Newspaper:** All newspaper and any inserts may be deposited at the newspaper window.

**Mixed Paper and Magazines:** All other household paper, junk mail, envelopes, computer paper, shredded paper, magazines, catalogs, paper board (cereal boxes), and paper shopping bags.

**Corrugated Cardboard:** Corrugated cardboard should be separated from other paper. Cardboard must be clean, dry and flattened. We can accept all types of cardboard except wax coated cardboard. Cardboard goes into the bin at west end of the recycling building. Pizza boxes are not accepted as they contain oils. These can be deposited with regular trash.



**Clear #1 plastic:** These containers are marked PETE and include: soda bottles and condiment containers which vary in color from clear to green to brown. These must be rinsed clean and caps removed.



**#2 Plastics:** These products will have a #2 stamped on the bottom of the container. Examples: detergent bottles, mustard containers and milk jugs. These must be rinsed clean and caps removed.

**Aluminum Cans:** Aluminum cans, excluding pet food cans. Aluminum foil and plates are not recyclable.

**Tin Cans:** All other type metal containers including empty paint cans and pet food cans. These must be clean and dry and go into the plastic gaylords in front and to the left of the counter.

**Glass:** All glass products are to be put into the pit on the southwest corner of the building. We can take glass bottles, porcelain sinks and toilets, ceramics, plates, and window glass. All metal, plastic and wood parts must be removed.

**Vermont Returnable:** Any plastic or aluminum container that is labeled as "VT 5 cent deposit".

**Fluorescent Tubes:** These shall be deposited in a designated location.

**Used Motor Oil:** Used motor oil can be deposited in the designated container. Synthetic oils cannot be accepted.

**Scrap Metal:** Scrap metal can be deposited in the pit on the west side of the lot including appliances that do not contain refrigerant. Discarded engines must be free of fuel and oil.

**Tires:** Tires can be dropped off. We charge by size, minimum \$3.00.

**Freon:** any appliance that contains Freon, including refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, and dehumidifiers. Cost: \$15

**Electronics:** small electric appliances, radios, TVs, computers and related components.
