I. Open meeting of the NHPWA

II. Approval of February 19, 2025 meeting minutes

Spelling correction for Peter Kohalmi needed. K. Blomquist made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected. C. Hall seconded the motion. A. Lachance abstained. The motion carried unanimously.

 - a. Financials

 - c. NEAPWA State Awards Nominations due 4/15/25
 - i. Can be a self-nomination process. Last year NHPWA acted as a 'funnel' to help push nominations along. Need to encourage membership to apply, will do via email. D. Hudson to send this email.

 - Hanor-Swanson staff will be leading this discussion. 45 minutes (estimated by J. Vancour). Basic premise: How can a working Road Agent lead QA on municipal paving work?
